

## SYNOPSIS

Oliver, as the eldest son, has inherited his father's estate. Although his father instructed him to take good care of his brother, Orlando, he refuses to do so. He spitefully denies Orlando the education and property befitting a gentleman. Dennis, a friend of Oliver's, arrives to warn Oliver of a rumor that Orlando will challenge Charles the Wrestler to a fight. Oliver convinces Dennis that Orlando is dishonorable and will take whatever means necessary to win. Dennis promises to have Charles pummel Orlando.

**D**uke Senior has been usurped of his throne by his brother, Duke Frederick, and has fled to the Forest of Arden, where he lives with a band of loyal followers. Duke Frederick allows Duke Senior's daughter, Rosalind, to remain at court because of her friendship with his daughter, Celia. When the day Orlando is scheduled to fight Charles arrives, and the women witness Orlando's defeat of the court wrestler, Orlando and Rosalind instantly fall in love with one another. Rosalind keeps this a secret from everyone but Celia. Orlando learns about Oliver's plot against his life and decides to leave for the safety of Arden. Without warning, Duke Frederick has a change of heart regarding Rosalind and banishes her. She, too, decides to flee to the Forest of Arden and leaves with Celia, who cannot bear to be without Rosalind, and Touchstone, the court jester. To ensure the safety of their journey, Rosalind assumes the dress of a young man and takes the name Ganymede, and Celia dresses as a common shepherdess and calls herself Aliena.

**D**uke Frederick is furious at his daughter's disappearance. When he learns that the flight of his daughter and niece coincides with the disappearance of Orlando, the duke orders Oliver to lead the manhunt, threatening to confiscate Oliver's lands and property should he fail.

**D**uke Senior lives in the Forest of Arden with a band of lords who have gone into voluntary exile. Orlando, exhausted by travel barges in on the duke's camp and demands food. Duke Senior calms Orlando and, when he learns that the young man is the son of his dear friend, accepts him into his company. Meanwhile, Rosalind and Celia, disguised as Ganymede and Aliena, arrive in the forest and meet a lovesick young shepherd named Silvius who pines away for Phoebe. The two women purchase a modest cottage, and soon Rosalind, as Ganymede, runs into the equally lovesick Orlando. Taking her to be a young man, Orlando confides in Rosalind that his affections are overpowering him. Rosalind, as Ganymede, claims to be an expert in exorcising such emotions and promises to cure Orlando of lovesickness if he agrees to pretend that Ganymede is Rosalind and promises to come woo her every day. Orlando agrees, and the love lessons begin.

Meanwhile, Phoebe becomes increasingly cruel in her rejection of Silvius. When Rosalind intervenes, disguised as Ganymede, Phoebe falls hopelessly in love with Ganymede. One day, Orlando fails to show up for his tutorial with Ganymede. Rosalind, reacting to her infatuation with Orlando, is distraught until Oliver appears. Oliver describes how Orlando stumbled upon him in the forest and saved him from being devoured by a hungry lioness. Oliver and Celia, still disguised as the shepherdess Aliena, fall instantly in love and agree to marry. As time passes, Phoebe becomes increasingly insistent in her pursuit of Ganymede, and Orlando grows tired of pretending that a boy is his dear Rosalind. Rosalind decides to end the charade. She promises that all will be wed to their true love if everyone pledges to meet the next day at the wedding. They all agree.

The group congregates before Duke Senior and his men. Rosalind, still disguised as Ganymede, reminds the lovers of their various vows, then secures a promise from Phoebe that if for some reason she refuses to marry Ganymede she will marry Silvius, and a promise from the duke that he would allow his daughter to marry Orlando if she were available. Rosalind removes her disguise and vows to marry Orlando. Phoebe agrees to marry Silvius. Celia and Oliver also plan to marry, along with Audrey and Touchstone. The couples dance and sing, happy in the knowledge that they will soon be married.





## **BAY AREA SHAKESPEARE CAMP**



For over 30 years San Francisco Shakespeare Festival has been offering **Shakespeare Camps** for kids of all experience levels, ages 7 to 18. Camp sessions range from 2 to 4 weeks and are held in venues across the Bay Area, typically on weekdays during summer break, with a few weekend and spring and fall options as well.

Our teaching artists are working actors, stage managers, directors, and designers. In each session campers engage with each other in activities ranging from games and basic acting skills to more specialized training and deeper exploration of the themes and language of Shakespeare, culminating in a live performance attended by family and friends

## ADVANCED SHAKESPEARE WORKSHOP



Advanced Shakespeare Workshop is our 4-week conservatory-style program for ages 12-18. Enrollment in this program requires previous acting experience and an audition submission. (See details below.) Participants take a deep dive into the themes and language of Shakespeare and engage in a thorough examination of character motives and objectives, along with intensive voice, movement, text, and monologue work. The program culminates in an hour-long performance, to which family and friends are invited.

### IN-SCHOOL SESSIONS



We also provide <u>in-school sessions</u> to help educators in the classroom. Let our expert teaching artists activate your students' creativity, connection, and confidence. Building upon the foundation of your classroom, we facilitate the artistic and personal growth of each student while transforming the group into a fun, engaging, interactive ensemble, using curriculum that is specifically tailored to learning objectives and adapts to students. Our Education program brings over 30 years of educational and theatrical expertise to students for an immersive experience that they will never forget!

Most of our programs can be taught in-person or virtually.

# SHAKESPEARE ON TOUR



2024 touring production of As You Like It

For 34 years our <u>Shakespeare on Tour</u> program has traveled across California to bring a one-hour version of a Shakespeare play to thousands of students. Our touring troupe brings sets, props, costumes, and music to enliven their active and engaging performance. The tour visits more schools and libraries than any other theater group in the state.

### SHAKESPEARE'S HEARTBEAT



Shakespeare's Heartbeat uses the Hunter Heartbeat Method developed by Kelly Hunter of Flute Theatre, utilizing the iambic pentameter (heartbeat rhythm) of Shakespeare's words and the physicality of his characters to engage with students on the autism spectrum. It is also effective across a constellation of abilities. Geared towards grades 4-12, this program's interactive games and gestures are paired with short phrases from Shakespeare's works to improve social skills and help with identifying and expressing emotions.

## SHAKESPEARE FOR ALL NEIGHBORS



Shakespeare for All Neighbors (S4AN) is a pilot storytelling workshop series taking place in San Francisco's Tenderloin. This ongoing program meets Friday afternoons. Neighbors experiencing homelessness in the Tenderloin engage with workshops in Shakespeare and Storytelling. Festival teaching artists lead group exercises in creative thinking, acting, improv, and storytelling.
